

Worship is like water. (part 3)

Sometimes, it's like water from a hose. Now that I'm in my 'advanced years' I recognize that childhood memories become idealized and cinematized. They are only about half actual events and half emotional and half dream and sometimes half fantasy. That's a lot of 'halves' I know but you get what I mean.

One of these memories is drinking water from the hose. You see, that's what I mean. Just that statement alone means almost nothing. It holds no magical imagery or heroic undertones. But as I conjure it back up from my 'sandlot' days of summer baseball; and my cowboy and Indian wars in the hot, sticky summer woods; and muggy, eighty degree summer night kick-the-can games, I can vividly remember how the water tasted as it came straight from the hose.

Back in the day, we weren't enlightened to 'bottled water' phenomenon yet. Very rarely did any of us, (or our parents) think to take a thermos of water with us to the park or woods or vacant lot. Occasionally someone would have an old canteen when we were 'on patrol' but it was even rarer that we would share it, and even then, it tasted like metal, and was lukewarm or down right as hot as the summer was anyway.

Forget about running in the house for a drink. That may happen once. But when I went in, then all my buddies would need a drink. I remember how excited mom was when I declared "and I need one for Timmy, and Chippy and Billy and Derek and ... wait le'me see, I think Doug and Darren are out there now." And before they were finished the word was out that Marc's mom is giving drinks...! By the end of the first week of summer vacation, the New House Rule was, once you go out, you stay out. No running in or out for drinks! I think all the moms had Morse code, because once one house declared the rule, every other mom ratified the vote and it was LAW.

Back then (before video games of any kind) we were determined to get every minute of playtime we could before going in. At the ball field, hot and dusty, fighting over calls at second base, and keeping siblings from killing each other, we could work up a powerful thirst. It was on one of these such days that I had my first understanding of JOY! We all left the ball field together, looking like refugees from North Africa, or maybe an escaped chain-gang from South Alabama. There was ball-field dust in every pore. Caked and layered in every crease of our clothes, and everywhere we had sweated. A dust cloud followed us down the street under the 85 degree, noon day sun. Now, we knew darn well that nobody's mom was going to let US in, but we had to try. We used every sad and pathetic line we could remember, borrowing quotes from Opie, and from Timmy and Lassie, "but Ma, I really think we might die!" Nothing doing. From house to house we went until we came to mine. I saw my mom's shadow in the door as we came close. Although it was just a faint image through the screen door I knew not to even waste my breath. We all went to the back yard to come up with a plan and keep our minds off our inevitable demise. Then I noticed it. Curled up back the basement steps. My dad had left the hose out and it was still attached, which meant the inside water valve might still be turned on. After promising to be absolutely silent in our mission, we took the spray nozzle off the end of the hose and carried it out as far as it would reach toward the street. A running hose would make a mud hole in a hurry. Timmy got the end and I turned the knob. WATER! Everyone got their fill, passing it back and forth till the street was covered, their shoes and shirts were covered, their dusty (now muddy) faces turned into solid grins. By the time I got a hold for my turn, the water was running cool, almost cold. It was pouring out like liquid heaven and when it finally reached my mouth I could literally feel my body temperature drop as it went down my throat and into my stomach. I was being refreshed, revived, restored from the inside out. We drank so much we could make our stomach slosh so loud each other could hear it. It wasn't too long before we were spraying each other's face then hands and by the time I heard my mother yell, "turn it off, that's enough' she was right. We had had enough. We were full. We were new. We were alive! We were born again!

Sometimes, worship is like water from a hose.

It fills me up from the inside. When my face is flush with shame, or anger. When things outside me are weighing down on me like the heat of an August sun. When I know I can't change my outer circumstances, sometimes, just being in God's holy presence can satisfy my soul. I declare that God is good. I close my eyes and ears to the things of this world and listen... hard....and close..... Slowly His love for me is revealed, like a stream of living water within me. Like a steady flow of cool water from a garden hose. Nothing has changed outside, but within me, I am cooling off, I am being refreshed and revived. I feel full of hope and promise. I feel alive again, and ready to go back on the playing field. I feel born again. You know although I have never been a shepherd, I get David's words. "The Lord leadeth me beside the still waters, He restoreth my soul."

Worship is not only done in crowds, in stadiums or sanctuaries, **sometimes it's done** by yourself. When I declare His majesty and power in my life, He becomes Majestic and Mighty in a very real way to me and in me. And when you worship, you are **never alone**! The Lord will reveal Himself in new and refreshing ways as the Holy Spirit,

which is poured out in our hearts, makes us alive with Christ.

Hey, somebody turn on the faucet!!!

Financial Update

In Luke 6: 37-38, Jesus said, "Give, and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together and running over, will be poured into your lap. For with the measure you use, it will be measured to you (NIV)." Jesus is telling us that we will receive back what we give and more! The measure we receive will be "pressed down, shaken together and running over." In this scripture, Jesus is telling us that we get to choose what is "poured into our laps." How? By our own level of generosity.

During November, Pastor Marc has been teaching us not to dwell on what we do <u>not</u> have, but to acknowledge and praise God for what He has given us, and to believe that He will meet all our needs, both as individuals and as the corporate body of Christ, according to His riches in glory.

Here is some encouraging financial information. In September 2014, giving was \$246,207, -12% below giving of \$279,781 for the same period in 2013. As of November 24, 2014, giving was \$330,898, less than -1% below giving through the end of November 2013, \$337,133. With one Sunday left in November, I believe that we will make up the difference for November, and by the end of December, I believe that we will exceed last year's giving. Through November 2014, we have reduced the mortgage on the church by \$250,000. We are increasing our giving, paying off our mortgage, paying our vendors on time, and reaching out into our community to help those in need. In January 2015, I will provide a full financial report for 2014. ... "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the first and greatest commandment." Matthew 22:37-38

I recently attended the 21st Annual National Christian Apologetics Conference in Charlotte, North Carolina. The 2 day conference had close to two thousand participants and roster of speakers that left you wishing you could clone yourself and attend multiple lectures at one time.

The conference follows three tracks so there is something for everyone. These tracks included God & Science, Christianity & Culture, and Historical Apologetics. Speakers included theologians, philosophers, astronomers, geneticists, archeologists, and professors, just to mention a few, all working in their field to make a case for what they believe and sharing that knowledge with others so we are better equipped to make a case for what we believe.

And this is really what the conference is about each year; being better equipped to share what we believe with others. This is what energizes me and excites me, and why I attend and want to tell you about it. I love to engage people that I work with or meet regularly in conversations about life and their beliefs. The more prepared I am, the bolder I feel to lead conversations in directions that will be meaningful. This often happens when discussing books people have read, movies they watch, or events in the news, or what's going on in their life.

We face an increasing onslaught every day of news articles, tweets, Facebook memes, college professor's comments, political opposition, and apathy to the beliefs we hold dear. We need to be bold as Christians to share our beliefs and teach our children and youth what we know. Don't assume they are picking up on them or learning them in Sunday school and youth group. Prepare yourselves and them to "always be ready to give an answer...." not the perfect answer. We don't have to be experts on every topic but there are answers out there and Christians do not have to take a defensive position. We all have our specific areas of interest and it's good to admit when we don't have an answer to a question and are willing to look it up. Here is a sampling of just a few of the excellent speakers who helped equip us at the conference.

One of our favorite speakers at the conference is Hugh Ross, PH.D. He is an astronomer, and pastor and shows how a commitment to the Bible is not incompatible with science. His organization, Reasons to Believe, is a good resource for the science minded who wonder how current scientific discoveries align with the Bible. <u>www.reasons.org</u>

Michael J. Behe, PH.D is a biologist working with the Discovery Institute. He has written extensively about Darwinism. He discussed his book *Darwin's Black Box* and also presented the Discovery Institute's latest film *Privileged Species*. I encourage you to look it up at www.discovery.org.

John C. Sanford PH.D is a semi-retired assistant professor at Cornell University and is currently researching the limitations of mutation and natural selection. He lectured on his research and his book about genetic entropy.

There was a discussion panel about the reliability of the NT documents. The panel included Professor Gary Habermas from Liberty University, J. Warner Wallace, a Homicide Detective who has written a book about assessing the eye witness accounts of the NT the way you would the eye witness in a crime scene, Dr. Joseph Bergeron who has studied extensively the medical accounts of crucifixions, and archeologist Bryant Wood PH.D known for his work excavating around Jericho.

Walter Kaiser PH.D, retired President of Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary spoke on the reliability of the Old Testament documents. He has written extensively on this topic and I recommend his works if this area is of interest to you.

There were sessions about philosophy in science, ethics, the Christian's role in politics, the problem of evil, and defending inerrancy of the Bible. The list goes on. Come see me if you'd like to hear about more of the sessions or get a complete list of speakers for more reading material. Southern Evangelical Seminary has an app where many of the sessions become

available for listening as a podcast and the session are available to order for a nominal fee.

The dates for next year's conference have just been announced. They are October 16-17, 2015 in Charlotte, NC. I'd love to see you there!

The Parsonage is rented!

Thanks to all who made this possible. Income from this rental is used to offset the housing allowance with a portion kept in reserve towards parsonage maintenance costs.

Heating maintenance update

During the 4th quarter preventive maintenance work and inspections on our heating and air conditioning systems, our contractor found 5 heat exchangers in our roof top units (RTU) that are defective due to flue gases corroding holes in the exchanger pipes. The HVAC industry rates the typical life of heat exchangers to be 10-15 years. Ours were installed when the church was built, meaning ours have lasted about 13 years. Holes in these heat exchangers can allow carbon monoxide gas and other toxic fumes to enter the inside of the building. As a result the gas valves have been shut off to all the affected units. Heating will not occur until new exchangers are installed. Power to these units have been left on so fans and air conditioning can be operational as needed.

All of these must be replaced before cold weather is upon us. Once replaced, the exchangers are warranted for 10 years by the manufacture, Trane, and our contractor provides one year warrantee on the labor. With these issues as well as previously known problems with other HVAC units the cost of repair is over \$27,000. The Trustees and the Finance Committee are working on establishing a payment plan to minimize the impact on our cash flow.


