Later on Sunday evening, I lie awake in bed trying to recollect everything I said during the sermon or during worship. Trusting that I was lead by the Holy Spirit, but very well aware of the fact that if I talk long enough, I will eventually say something I might regret! So, my thoughts turn toward the next sermon, or more accurately the next worship service.

As I have reminded the congregation, and myself, worship is supposed to be an everyday thing, not a one-hour Sunday thing. I believe that worship is how we live our lives all week, while Sunday morning is when the church gathers to celebrate God's grace in our lives since we last met, and give testimony/witness to God's great and mighty acts. It is a time when the church takes advantage of its unity and oneness to seek God with all our hearts and pray for one another, and show God's love toward one another while all along, acknowledging His presence among us. Can I get an Amen?!

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So, why do I immediately begin to anticipate the next worship service? Almost as if I don't plan to worship until then. I need to start listening to my own sermons. Who said amen? I think the way most churches do this can be why Sunday's have so much stress attached to them, at least for those who are regular 'worshippers'.

We begin by trying to understand the scripture for next week, then the choir or band or bells rehearse for the 'big show', hymns must be chosen, and the bulletins must be 'prepared'. Depending upon the size of the congregation and the number of leaders involved the anticipation is palpable. Among each of the leaders there is an **expected** performance AND along with it, an **anticipated** response form the audience, oops, I meant congregation. When hands aren't raised, when amens don't come, when power point slides are mixed up, when babies cry at just the wrong time, when the liturgist mispronounces the words in the text... **Frustration** enters the room.

I have probably said too much already but I'll go on. I want to offer you a way to attend church next week without the stress. I want to give you permission to NOT judge the performance. Perhaps judge is too harsh a word, then replace it with 'evaluate' if it makes you feel better. Sunday services are not American Idol, or First Church Has Got Talent! You are not the reason we go to church. The pastor is not the reason we go to church, the special music, or music leader or children's choir or band, or stained glass windows or even to see old friends. THE reason we gather; the object of our attention; the center and purpose of our efforts to get up, get dressed and get out, is GOD!

When you look forward to giving God your worship on Monday and Tuesday and all week, your acts of worship will flow naturally. God will be at the center of your mind and heart as you dwell in Him and Christ dwells in you, the Holy Spirit will bear witness to your spirit and worship will result.

Start right now, look for God in your life today, in your world today. Where is God and what is God doing right now? Get involved. Next Sunday when you walk into the sanctuary, you will be prepared. All the expectations will be met because you have come to declare once again your love for God, your allegiance to God, and to celebrate what God has been doing and will do in your life. That worship does not depend on nor is it affected by which song you sing or what dress you wear or what color the vestments are or how long the service lasts. If you give yourself to God, fully and wholly, then what's to disappoint you? Certainly God will not be disappointed. Its not burnt offerings (or great solos or eloquent preaching) that He desires. And only then will all your expectations be met, only then will you leave church truly satisfied, only then will your joy be complete.

Now I can't wait to worship again, in fact, why wait till Sunday, I'm gonna start right now!

"REJOICE!"

"Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice!" *Philippians 4:4*

As a youngster, my mother used to teach scriptures to me and my two sisters by singing songs based on the scripture. One such melody that I heard growing up was this passage from *Philippians 4:4*. Although I learned this at a very young age, only as an adult have I come to realize the powerful significance of these Holy Spirit inspired words.

In my younger days, I understood that these instructions to the church at Phillipi meant that they should praise God... therefore, so should we. Now that I'm in my not-so-younger days, a much deeper lesson has become clear that's a lot more challenging than the previous perspective. God's word to us is not just to rejoice in Him, but "Rejoice in the Lord always". The key word here is "always". Now, I have absolutely no problem rejoicing in, praising and worshiping God on a regular basis...but rejoice always?? Isn't that asking for a bit too much?? After all, doesn't always mean...like...all the time?? What about those difficult, challenging days when maybe I just don't feel like rejoicing in the Lord? Don't I get a pass on those days? What about the times when it feels like the weight of this world's struggles are more than I can bear? Surely God will understand if I just skip those stormy times, knowing I'll get back to rejoicing in Him once the rain, thunder and lightning come to an end and the clouds give way to a beautiful blue sky with its peaceful sunshine. Here's the incredible and challenging detail about Philippians 4:4. The Apostle Paul was inspired to write these words while he was sitting in a Roman prison! He was not exactly having a good day! He was in the midst of a time of suffering for the cause of Christ. What an eye opener! Without a doubt, he was instructing the church to do what he had already been doing himself...praising God right in the middle of his life's extreme difficulties.

Why would he... and why should we do that?? The English Dictionary defines the word rejoice as a verb which means "be happy". Are we instructed to rejoice or be happy about our challenges or life's hard circumstances and tragedies? Absolutely not! We are to rejoice **in God!** As, I'm sure Paul discovered, when we choose to do this in the midst of our own "prison challenges", we are expressing to God that we trust Him. As we rejoice, God may not always change our circumstances, but He becomes our source of hope, strength and peace as He carries us through our most difficult times. In the middle of some hard times of his own, King David sings to The Lord these words in *Psalm 13:5* "But I trust in your unfailing love; my heart **rejoices** in your salvation." David sings again in *Psalm 21:1* "The king **rejoices** in your strength, Lord."

As we have turned a page into the New Year, I am making it a personal goal for 2015 to do my best to heed the instructions of Apostle Paul and choose to rejoice in the Lord always, in good days or in challenging ones. But, I confess, I'd rather not do this alone...care to join me??

Finally, brothers and sisters, **rejoice**! **2 Corinthians 13:11**
