

### **Motel Ministry 1st Event Debriefing**

Thanks to all of you from Riverton who participated through prayer, supplies, and your hands and feet in our inaugural Motel Ministry event, with the assistance of Teens Opposing Poverty (TOPs) founder, Steve Jennings. It was a great start to another way to move beyond our doors and out into our community. On Sunday, April 12<sup>th</sup>, with a great group of volunteers, youth, adults and a very happy therapy dog, from Riverton and from Randolph-Macon Academy (RMA), we ventured out with our food, supplies, and good cheer to two of our local motels

So how did it go? Here are some comments from one of our volunteers, Amy Jewell, and her experience with a couple of the residents...

"The youth and adults eagerly knocked on doors and eventually met two men who were interested in coming out to receive some of our light, love, and food. Abbie eagerly offered her warm love and wagging tail at once, helping to break the ice, as she always does so easily. Her warmth melted some of the shyness which helped to open the door for one of the residents to share some of his life journey with me. He had fallen on some rough times and along with some poor decisions, had found himself in a rut and on a rough road. He shared that with the help of House of Hope in Front Royal, he had found another way to live and even does some work for them now. He shared his belief in the importance of God, one day at a time, and the importance of God in changing one life at a time. He was familiar with where Riverton was located, but didn't indicate if he had ever been there.

He and his friend thoroughly enjoyed Abbie's personality, which is always exuding love to all she comes in contact with. The resident that I spoke to seemed to relate to Abbie when I shared that she was a rescue. He replied back "She got another chance, just like me." He encouraged me to visit with Abbie at the House of Hope (maybe another outreach opportunity door being opened for Riverton).

With one last kiss from Abbie to the resident and an offer of her paw to the other resident, we said goodbye and how great it was to have met them. They were truly grateful for the food, donations, and fellowship Riverton brought to them with God's direction that day, making a positive difference in their day."

What great joy it is to share God's love to others and with others! Watch for more opportunities in the months to come to serve in this way as this ministry continues to take shape.
