

Worship is like water. (part 2)

Sometimes, it is like the water of the ocean. While the Ocean offers some blessings similar to those from a swimming pool, there are however some very different conditions to be experienced in the waves of an ocean. I was an adult when I first visited and experienced the beach. Since then I have lived in beach cities, and visited beaches in many states and countries. Its hard to deny that there is an allure to them. There, for me, is a wooing, a drawing, a 'come-hither-ness' to the waves as they roll in. Many times we would say "we're only going to walk along the beach, we're NOT getting wet." Yet, almost always, we leave carrying shoes and socks in our hands, pant legs rolled up, seashells in our pockets and sand in the car. There is something about the consistency, the subtle sounds, like white-noise, that captivates and beckons me.

There are also times when I fully intend to get into the water. I surrender completely to the call and dive into the waves. I love how I have extra buoyancy in the salt water and that, unlike my backyard pool, this is not a passive endeavor. I am held up by the water, refreshed by it even, yet, I am in competition with it somehow. There is a struggle of sorts. The waves, if given their will completely, would take me to where they would have me go, not where I want to go. They will and do pull me down the beach, away from my resting place, where I first entered. They will, and do, continually push me back to shore while pulling out further. If I don't struggle, wrestle, kick and squirm and swim, I will end up in a different place than where I started. Another interesting truth about swimming in the ocean is that the further you go out, the deeper the water, the calmer the experience. But, it is also much more risky and even a little dangerous.

Many times worship can be like an Ocean swim for me. For those of us who lead worship as an occupation, or even those of you who have been extremely faithful to your local church for a long, long time, sometimes we go looking for something a little different, a change of venue, change of music style, change of location. When I get an opportunity to experience a worship service outside of my congregation I often look for a youth-oriented service. One with a full praise band, lots of people, and very loud, repetitious and familiar music. I usually come late, sit in the back and pick a seat that will be easiest to leave from without anyone noticing me. I intend not to stay long, you know, not get wet. I prefer to be lost in the crowd and swallowed up by the sound. I have experienced intimacy with Christ in settings like this that remind me of the ocean. The energy and volume of the music is overpowering. I cannot drift off in my mind, or temporarily forget why I'm here. The music, like the waves, is relentless, it keeps on coming, it hits hard and direct and in my face, and though there may be a brief pause for reflection or scripture the next wave hits just as hard, and another and another, until I feel like I can no longer just 'enjoy the singing' as some have said. I am now in a struggle with it or I am competing against it. The music demands that I sing, the lyrics I sing make powerful and compromising promises and declarations about me, about my life, and about my God. If I fight against this Holy Spirit tractor-beam and demand to stand my ground, stay where I am, not be tossed around and manipulated and to remain 'in-control', then I will leave the water-I mean sanctuary-in the same place I went in. I will be a little bruised, perhaps a little shaken but essentially unchanged. But, if I surrender to His will and go where the Holy Spirit will take me, I will end up leaving in a different place. I may go deeper yet. Fear has always kept me from the deep water of God's presence. Stories of 'holy-roller' activities, mindless and embarrassing utterances, emotional breakdowns, etc. have kept me "safe in the shallow water".

Sometimes I experience worship as a series of unrelenting waves of grace. Each wave rolling over me, exposing me, turning me around only to allow me enough to time to stand before the next wave hits. If I stay in long enough I become completely broken. This is not that gentle, refreshing spirit I thought it was. Christ is not the tender healer I assumed would come.

"Aslan is NOT a tame Lion, after all."

I leave with sand burns and scrapes, tired legs, spent emotions and tearless eyes, having given everything I could just to remain there, just to survive there. And now, as I lick my wounds and bind my heart, I begin to see how much stronger I've become. I now see how much more there is waiting for me in Christ. My horizon is stretched, my boundaries expanded, my possibilities multiplied and my Hope secured. Like standing on the shore and trying to imagine just how much water there really is before me, God takes on a grandeur and largeness that shrinks all my fears and conquers all my foes!

Waves of Mercy, waves of Grace, oh my God, this love, how can it be? Amazing Love, how can it be? That You, my King, should die for me?

May the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ bless and keep you today.

What does this Brick Mean?

We Praise God for You! October's Giving is up over 25% from August and September

And now so that EVERYONE understands;

The Poster of our church building on the stand in the Gathering Room is a symbol of who we are and the huge step of faith that we have taken to honor and serve the Lord Jesus in this community.

When it was unveiled at the end of September, it had 200 magnetic bricks lined up along the bottom. These bricks represent our giving to God's Kingdom work through Riverton UMC. We are asking everyone to take a brick or bricks to represent your monthly contributions. So, if you normally give \$200 per month, then you should remove 1 brick and place it somewhere at home to remind you that you are part of what God is building. If you normally give \$400 or have decided to increase your giving then you should remove 1 (one) brick for every \$200. Your normal giving includes all tithes, offerings and special giving that you have or intend to give each month by God's grace.

You and I can see by the display how many bricks are left and how far we are from our goal of \$200 from 200 people for 200 days. If this was unclear to you before, please update the poster the next time you are in the building.
